OPEN CLASS OUTDOOR EXHIBITS GENERAL RULES

General Rules for Open Class Livestock

1. **Pre-registration due by June 30th. LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**
2. All animals, except dairy cattle, must arrive at the fairgrounds between Noon and 7:00 p.m., Wednesday of fair week. (See Dairy Section for dairy cattle requirements.) **Animals must be removed on Sunday of fair week between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m.**
3. All market animals will be weighed upon arrival to fairgrounds. If an exhibitor feels that the weigh-in is incorrect they have 15 minutes to notify the scale house and re-weigh the animal one (1) time.
4. Market animals determined to be stags or cryptorchids will not be eligible for Grand or Reserve Champion.
5. No sale will be held for exhibits.
6. Each exhibitor must bring their own feed and be responsible for the care, watering and feeding of their animal until animal is shipped or taken home. Failure to do so may result in a forfeiture of premium and a \$20.00 fine that may be assessed by the project specific and/or the Overall Superintendent.
7. Shavings will be furnished – do not bring straw.
8. Unless otherwise noted, exhibitor may enter only 1 animal per lot number.
9. All animals must be manageable and exhibitors must be in full control of their animals. If an animal is felt to be unmanageable, the animal may not show. Project specific and/or Overall Livestock Superintendent will rule if an animal is unmanageable.
10. **All animals must appear in the show ring to receive a ribbon rating.** All animals must be shown as directed by the Superintendent or judge. Any exhibitor refusing to give any information required may be ordered from the ring.
11. RECOMMENDED DRESS CODE: Plain white button-up collared shirt (long or short sleeved, not sleeveless), black pants, and black tie are required for both the show and sale unless noted otherwise under individual specie's section. Hard soled shoes or boots are recommended for safety.
12. Unless otherwise noted, all judging will be completed using the modified Danish System. If the animal does not deserve a ribbon, none will be awarded. Judges decision is final.
13. No one will be allowed in the show ring except appropriate class exhibitors, superintendents, judges, and designated persons.
14. Chronic diseases, deformity or any serious defect or imperfections disqualifies animals or birds from entry. Brucellosis and tuberculosis tests are not required on exhibition livestock (including beef, sheep, swine, dairy cattle, and goats) regardless of age. The fair management reserves the right to call a veterinarian, should a situation arise, at the cost of the exhibitor.
15. Check department rules and regulations for specific related information on all livestock and poultry exhibits.
16. Identical items may not be entered in any other Division at the Fair, including 4-H Classes.

Barn Rules

1. No unauthorized vehicles in the multipurpose or 4-H facility building.
2. The Lewis & Clark County Law Enforcement will enforce the 12:00 midnight "curfew".
3. There is absolutely no alcohol, drugs, or smoking in the Multipurpose building.
4. Multipurpose will be closed MIDNIGHT to 6:00 a.m. A responsible adult must be in the facility at all times. There will be shifts 12:00 - 3:00 a.m. and 3:00 - 6:00 a.m. per night.
5. **All exhibitors must assist in the take down and removal of pens. Failure to do so may result in a \$50.00 fine at the discretion of the species or overall livestock superintendent.** Cleanup will begin at 7:00 a.m. on Sunday of fair week.
6. NO WATER fights allowed inside the facilities. This includes water guns, buckets, hoses, etc.
7. All areas should be kept clean and equipment maintained in an orderly fashion.
8. No vulgar or foul language is to be used.
9. No wrestling inside the facilities.
